#### Location


In the center of the Americas, Panama limits north with the Caribbean Sea, south with the Pacific Ocean, east with Colombia and west with Costa Rica.

## Connectivity

Panama offers great advantages as the Hub of the Americas. Tocumen International Airport connects Panama City to key European destinations such as Germany, Spain, France, Italy, The Netherlands and Turkey through direct flights with Lufthansa, Iberia, KLM, Air France and Turkish Airlines.

#### Weather

Panama has Tropical climate throughout the year in the lowlands, and temperate climate in the highlands. At sea level the average annual temperature is 27°C / 80.6°F. There are 2 seasons: dry season from December to April and rainy from May through November.

### **Accomodations**

## **Currency**


The US Dollar circulates freely and parallel to the Panamanian Balboa, which has parity with US\$.





1,002 species of birds, more than in Canada, the United States and Mexico combined.






1,500 species of trees, 675 species of ferns and 1,200 species of orchids.
